THANSGIVING FOR LIGHT

(The candles are lit.)

- One: The Lord be with you.
- All: And also with you.
- One: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- One: Eternal God by your word you commanded: "Let there be light!" By your Spirit you have revealed the light of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ. Shine in our hearts this night with the light of your good news and illumine our dreams with the vision of your holy realm; through Christ our Lord and in the unity of the Spirit, we give you thanks and praise now and forever.
- All: Amen.

We Proclaim God's Word

EVENING PRAYER

(The incense is lit.)

- One: Holy God, let the incense of our prayer ascend before you, and let your loving-kindness descend upon us, that with devoted hearts we may sing your praises with the church on earth and the whole heavenly host, and glorify you forever and ever. To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul.
- All: O God, in you I trust.
- One: Let my prayer rise before you as incense, O Lord,
- All: the lifting of my prayer as an evening sacrifice.
- One: Holy one, as you are well pleased with Christ, help us to live in a way that will be pleasing to you.
 As you have called us to listen to Christ, help us to always heed his word and seek his will. These things we pray in the name of Jesus, your beloved son, our savior and Lord. Hear us now loving God as we raise the joys and concerns of our hearts and minds to you and silent prayer.
 (A period of silent personal prayer.)
- One: As you have made this day, O God, you also make the night. Give light for our comfort. Come upon us with quietness and still our souls, that we may listen for the whisper of your Spirit and be attentive to your nearness in our dreams. Empower us to rise again in

new life to proclaim your praise, and show Christ to the world, for he reigns forever and ever.

All: Amen.
