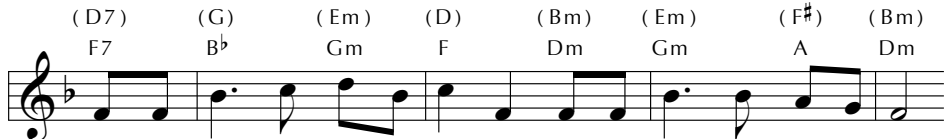

Breathe on Me, Breath of God 286

The musical score is written for a four-part vocal choir (Soprano, Alto, Tenor, Bass) and piano accompaniment. It is in the key of B-flat major (two flats) and 3/4 time. The melody is primarily in the Soprano and Alto parts, with the piano providing harmonic support. The lyrics are arranged in four lines, each corresponding to a vocal part. The first line of lyrics is: '1 Breathe on me, Breath of God; fill me with life a - new,'. The second line is: '2 Breathe on me, Breath of God, un - til my heart is pure,'. The third line is: '3 Breathe on me, Breath of God, till I am whol - ly thine,'. The fourth line is: '4 Breathe on me, Breath of God, so shall I nev - er die,'. The piano accompaniment consists of chords and single notes in the right and left hands. The right hand often plays chords, while the left hand plays single notes or simple chords. The overall mood is reverent and uplifting.

In both Hebrew and Greek, the words for “spirit” can equally well be translated as “breath” or “wind,” so it is very appropriate to address the Holy Spirit as the “Breath of God.” This tune by an English organist has become the customary one in North American hymnals.
