Leigh (née Barnett) was born in Nashville, TN and grew up in Dallas TX.

Leigh's parents joined Highland Park Presbyterian Church when she was a baby, she has no childhood memories in which the church was not an important part. Leigh began working with middle school youth when she was a student at the University of Texas at Austin. She helped to lead weekly youth fellowship and mission program offerings, and was a committed volunteer staff person on weekend retreats and Spring Break trips to Florida. Over the summer she would return home, where she remained active in the college ministry at church. She was on summer staff for the children's ministry one summer, and after her graduation from UT with a degree in history, she was a college summer staff intern. Leigh felt called to teach, but she also felt a strong call to youth ministry.

Leigh went back to school and earned her Master of Christian Education from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education in Richmond VA. While there she met her husband Mitchell Miller who was finishing up his final year at Union Theological Seminary. Mitch's first pastorate was to a small Presbyterian church in the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia, and the following Spring Leigh was graduated from PSCE. While they served this small church together, Leigh eventually accepted a call to a Presbyterian church across the border in Hagerstown, MD as the DCE. In 1999, they moved their now growing family to Fallston MD. Their son Nathan was born while they were still in West Virginia and Emma came along two years later after they moved to Fallston, MD.

The Millers moved to Oklahoma in 2009 when Mitch accepted a call to Santa Fe Presbyterian church. Leigh has continued to serve and lead the Christian Education Committee, teach youth in Sunday School, and help to plan and lead mission and fellowship events. She has served on the Indian Nations Presbytery Youth Committee since 2016 and is currently its chair. Now that both of their kids are off to college, Leigh can return to full time vocational ministry, sharing the gospel of Jesus through the educational and missional ministries of the church. Teaching, particularly church history and theology, really brings her joy. She loves building relationships with young people, and seeing Christ at work in their lives. She says that, "being able to share in those spirit awakening moments in the lives of children and young adults is absolutely amazing!"

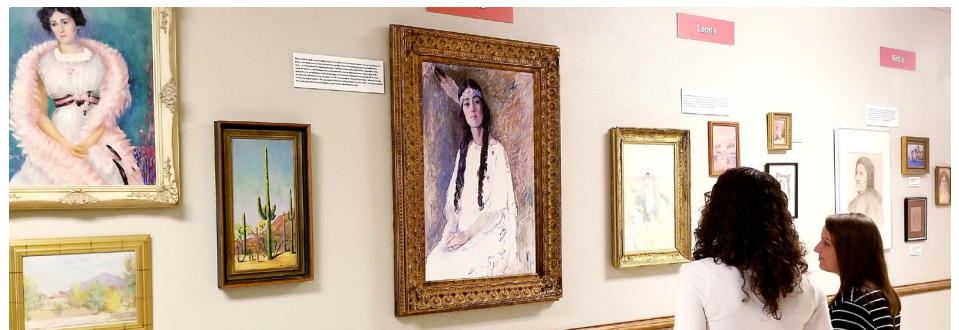
