# From the Pastor's Desk: Advent: Come. Lord Jesus! Our Lord Has Come!

Christ has come! Christ is risen! Christ will come again! In Advent, we are living between the first and the second coming of the Lord. In Advent we expectantly wait for the One who has already come.

Since the first century, Christians await the advent of the true Light. The season of Advent emphasizes both our remembrance of the past and our hope for the future. In Advent, the beginning and the end times meet. We live between our prayer for the future coming of the Lord, and our belief that the Lord has come as God's ultimate act in history.

I hope you will take on the spiritual discipline of daily devotions this Advent season. There are two resources available for you at the church.

"The Father's Love for each and every one of us is immeasurable," writes Henri Nouwen, a spiritual icon of the twentieth century, who wrote about that love for decades in insightful and inspiring writings that continue to captivate millions of readers. Excerpts of Nouwen's writings, as well as Scripture passages and original reflections and prayers within *The Father's Love*, will guide you through daily prayer and reflection as you gain a better sense of how the Father loves us and why he sent his only Son to dwell among us.

Peace on Earth is a collection of family devotions for Advent by Danielle Bean. She writes, "While we may never achieve perfect peace on this side of heaven, during Advent, we can work to bring the peace of Jesus to our broken world, beginning in our own homes and families. Peace on Earth will guide you and your family through a peace-filled Advent, allowing you to grow in love for one another and to bring more peace to the world. Together, this Advent season, let us look to Jesus in the manger and open our hearts to receive the peace that can only come from him."

Advent begins December 2nd. I encourage you to stop by the church office and pick up a copy of whichever devotion sounds best to you. As we begin our Advent journey this year, in the midst of the busyness of the season, let us each commit to spending a few minutes with God each day in thought, Scripture, and prayer guided by our Advent Devotions. Perhaps within their pages we will discover or rediscover the greatest gift ever given in new and exciting ways. God bless you! *-Pastor John*

# Sunday School - Children and Youth

Our PreK-5th grades are beginning the Winter sessions of Growing in Grace and Gratitude from the PCUSA Publishing. "In Advent we see God's grace poured out. With Mary and the shepherds, we ponder and rejoice at this miracle. With Simeon and Anna, we marvel in God's grace. With the magi, we worship the newborn king. Through the stories of Luke, we are introduced to the beginning of Jesus' ministry as he is baptized by John in the Jordan River and then is tempted in the desert for forty days. Jesus announces his ministry quoting Isaiah 61 and people are at first amazed at his words and then angered at what they might mean. Jesus calls people to follow him, continuing to teach about God's upside-down world where the unexpected receive blessings and following God's way to live means loving, forgiving, and giving."

The Middle School and High School Youth will begin the month with a session on the meaning of Advent, and will have some short sessions, on various topics, before we begin a new series in the new year!

# Children in Worship

The worship bags in the sanctuary have been updated with new art supplies and will have worship bulletins and coloring sheets available for each week's lectionary reading. 
