# **Guest Preacher**

#### Sunday, June 2

Rev. Dr. James J. Kirk will preach from our pulpit this June. Rev. Kirk is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and in August of 2016, he accepted the position of Associate for Disaster Response (U.S.) for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. This position is responsible for coordinating the denomination's domestic response to the many disasters that impact our congregations, Presbyteries and communities. The mission of PDA is to bring "Out of Chaos, Hope."



Prior to this position, Rev. Kirk served congregations in Sparta, NJ and Naples, FL. He received his bachelor's degree in 1977 from Moravian College and was graduated from Union Theological Seminary in 1981 with

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Rev. Kirk is a Certified Compassion Fatigue Professional (CCFP) through the International Association of Trauma Professionals and a member of the International Critical Stress Foundation (ICSF). Rev. Kirk was a volunteer with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for over 20 years. In that role, he responded to a variety of disasters including natural and public violence.



Additionally, Rev. Kirk is a past chair of the National VOAD Emotional and Spiritual Care Committee and has been on the committee for nine years. He has also been a national and local volunteer with Red Cross since 2008 and was part of a team that developed the Disaster Spiritual Care program that is currently being integrated into Red Cross Chapters around the country.

Please join us in welcoming Rev. Kirk to our church. We will begin our summer schedule (June and July) of one worship service in the sanctuary that day, which begins at 9:30 a.m.

# **Monday Morning Bible Study**

# 7:30 a.m. Breakfast | 8:00 a.m. Study

Monday Morning Bible Study meets every Monday at Ingrid's—a German/American restaurant and bakery located at 3701 N. Youngs Blvd. in Oklahoma City. Previously, this bible study was a men's bible study, but has since dropped "men's" from the title as there are often women in attendance.

The group meets in the bar, which is separate from the restaurant, and the study begins at 8:00 a.m. Participants are encouraged to come earlier if they would like to order breakfast and eat before the study.

Beginning Monday, June 3 and continuing throughout July, the group will study a six-session video series by Timothy Keller entitled "The Reason for God: Conversations on Faith and Life."

Captured live and unscripted, pastor and author Timothy Keller meets with a group of people over six sessions to address their doubts and objections to Christianity. Using literature, philosophy, real-life experiences and the Bible, Keller and the group explore the truth of Christianity. The series is geared toward helping individuals to think about and engage others in dialogue on six common objections to Christianity.

# **Sunday LIFT**

#### **Living - In - Faith - Together**

So, what's the plan for Sunday School this summer?

To bring our church family closer together, we are offering an intergenerational LIFT class for all ages during the Sunday School hour (10:40-11:40) in June and July. We will meet in Watchorn Hall for food, fellowship, study, recreation and prayer/worship.

There is strength in the whole community of God—being the church together, we desire that our children have faith and not just religion. To quote John H. Westerhoff, "there is no way to say for sure if our children will or will not have faith, but one thing we can be sure, they will never have faith unless there is a community of faith for them to live in and be influenced by."

Each LIFT session begins with gathering together and moves through the four components of the first church, with all parts connected by a common theme.

#### We will:

- 1. Break Bread Together | A meal shared together is an important part of LIFT. When we eat together, we build relationships through sharing food and conversation.
- 2. Study God's Word Together | We will read scripture together. We will also have cross-generational discussions about what God's word is saying to each of us. It is important for different generations to learn from each other when interpreting scripture.
- 3. Play Together | Play comes in many shapes and forms. We may craft, play games, learn new skills and hobbies. What's important is that we are doing this together.
- 4. Pray Together | We worship and praise God through prayer. Prayer comes in many forms and can be done in a variety of ways. Most often, we end our time together in prayer.

# Pentecost | A Special Day and a Special Offering Sunday, June 9

During Pentecost, we celebrate that the Holy Spirit has opened the doors to faith in Jesus Christ. The day of Pentecost draws the great 50 days of Easter to a glorious conclusion. Red is the traditional color for the day symbolizing the fire of the spirit that rested on the disciples of Christ and gives life to the church. The powerful images of rushing wind and tongues of flame help convey some sense of this extraordinary event—the powerful symbolism of being commissioned for ministry through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

We will collect one of the four annual denominational offerings on Pentecost. When we give to the Pentecost Offering, we are helping to provide opportunities for young people to grow and share in their faith in Christ. Forty percent stays with this congregation to develop and support programs for young people in our own church and community. Ten percent is devoted to at-risk children to improve education and provide safe havens. Twenty-five percent supports Ministries with Youth to help guide our youth by uniting them in Christ and lifting them up as leaders and messengers of God's word. And twenty-five percent supports Young Adult Volunteers (YAV) serving in communities around the world and growing as leaders through transformative Christian service. YAV Cherokee Adams, while serving survivors of human trafficking, was moved in a way that altered her life. She sensed the Holy Spirit was shaping her. "It was kind of like the Pentecost story," Adams said. "The Holy Spirit took me and changed me in ways that I wasn't expecting." She now wants to attend seminary and be a parish pastor or a chaplain. Her goal is to "go out and tell the story."

The Pentecost Offering unites us in a churchwide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas and unique gifts with the church and the world. Our support helps nurture the faith of those who are the church to come—children, youth and young adults.
