Forgiving in the Name of God

The season of Lent is a time of prayer and selfexamination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. In the early church, Lent was a time of preparation for the celebration of baptism at the Easter Vigil. In many communities of faith, it remains a time to equip and nurture candidates for baptism and confirmation and to reflect deeply on the theme of baptismal discipleship.

We are delighted to continue the traditions of the church this year. Two of our young people, Max Keith and Caroline Kivett, will make their public profession of faith and be confirmed as active members of First Presbyterian Church during the 11:00 a.m. worship Easter morning.

I invite you to reflect with me this Lenten season on what I believe is a crucial theme of biblical discipleship: forgiveness. I want to share with you what Henri Nouwen writes in his book "Bread for the Journey," concerning Forgiving in the Name of God:

"We are all wounded people. Who wounds us? Often those whom we love and those who love us. When we feel rejected, abandoned, abused, manipulated, or violated, it is mostly by people very close to us: our parents, our friends, our spouses, our children, our neighbor, our teachers, our pastors. That's the tragedy of our lives."

"This is what makes forgiveness from the heart so difficult. It is precisely our hearts that are wounded. We cry out, 'You, who I expected to be there for me, you have abandoned me. How can I ever forgive you for that?"

Of course, those could be Jesus' words to every generation: "You, who I expected to be there for me, you have abandoned me. How can I ever forgive you for that?" We ask that question too. Not only of God, but also of human beings, even our companions in Christ.

Forgiveness is crucial in the life of the church. Both the Old and New Testaments speak of the importance of forgiveness and it is present as a central theme in the Lord's Prayer.

The "Passing of the Peace" was made a part of our worship liturgy because it was important to the early church for worshipers to make peace with those they had wronged or felt had wronged them so they could then be worthy to hear God's word read.

They recognized what we all know to be true: The need to forgive or seek forgiveness makes things awkward at best—and painful at worst—between ourselves and an another individual, a group of people or God. It creates emotional distance in relationships, sometimes between us and the people we care about most in the world, or even God.

Forgiveness often seems impossible, but nothing is impossible for God. The God who lives within us will give us the grace to go beyond our wounded selves and say, "In the Name of God you are forgiven." Let's pray for that grace.

During this season when we are called to reflect on where we have fallen short in our Christian witness, I invite us to reflect on forgiveness both when we have hurt others and when we have been wounded. But do not get mired in that place. Use the grace given to us by Jesus Christ to forgive, to seek forgiveness and to heal. Then as we "Pass the Peace" on Easter morning, may you experience true peace, the peace of Christ, in a new way.

Presbyterian Women (PW)

Presbyterian Women (PW) is an inclusive and caring community of women, committed to working toward God's promise of wholeness for all people. Presbyterian Women are women who are in any way affiliated with First Presbyterian Church of Oklahoma City.

PW Circles and the Least Coin

One of the offerings that Presbyterian Women collect each year in their individual Circles is called Fellowship of the Least Coin. Presbyterian Women who attend Circle meetings bring their spare change (Least Coin) and drop it into a globe-shaped bank. The coins are eventually collected and combined with other Presbyterian Women Circles. Grants are then solicited and awarded to the most deserving mission programs here and abroad.

More than 60 years ago, since the Fellowship of the Least Coin began, the coins donated by the women of First Presbyterian Church in Oklahoma City have helped to improve lives throughout the world.

Here are four examples of the 22 grants that were funded in 2019 from the Least Coins collected by Presbyterian Women Circles:

- 1. In Burundi (Africa): A grant to support widows, women and street girls. This project promotes girls' education and the economic empowerment of widows and street girls in Burundi.
- 2. In Malaysia (Asia): A grant for home nursing care. This project provides nursing care to needy and neglected elderly women in Malaysia.
- 3. In Thailand (Asia): A sewing project and food bank. This project allows church women to make a living without leaving their local Thai villages.
- 4. In Syria (Middle East): A grant for emergency relief aid for the children of Syrian refugees. This project addresses the basic needs of vulnerable Syrian refugee girls, in order to help prevent and protect them from violence and exploitation.

Last year, approximately \$100,000 in grants were funded by Presbyterian Women Circles' Least Coin contributions. The average grant was for \$4500. For the three Circles at FPCOKC, our Least Coin contributions, however small, are used as a catalyst to bring about peace, justice and reconciliation beyond our local borders. ~ Susan Perry
