From the Pastor

A liturgical year, the way the church marks time, consists of the cycle of seasons in Christian churches. Most of the year is marked by Ordinary Time. In this case the term "ordinary" means standard, normative or typical. The Sunday's of Ordinary Time celebrate the good news of Christ's death and resurrection and the unfolding presence of the new creation.

"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust,

and to dust you shall return."

-Genesis 3:19

Twice each year Ordinary Time is

joyfully interrupted by the extra-ordinary time of the Christmas and Easter seasons. Ash Wednesday ushers in the season of Lent and the beginning of the Easter cycle. During this extra-ordinary time, we intensify our focus on the doctrine of resurrection.

The season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. It is a period of 40 days—like the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Nineveh to repent and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness.
