Pastor's Class

On September 12 there will be an additional offering during the Sunday School hour. The class will be taught by myself in partnership with others. I am very grateful to co-teach with Blaine Moore as we get started.

We will begin with a Bible study called *Disciple Fast Track*. The class will introduce the grand sweep of the Bible over 24 weeks. Participants will receive a brief but thorough introduction to the Bible. On Rally Day, we will start a twelve-week overview of the Old Testament and then spend the next twelve weeks in the New Testament, beginning in January.

The class is not only designed for conveying information, but also to help participants explore the spiritual disciplines of individual daily Bible study, reflection and prayer. It's going to be an adventure as we explore 24 great themes of the Bible.

Splash Down on Rally Day Sunday, September 12 | 9:30 a.m.

September 12 is the official Rally Day for the start of Sunday School, and it promises to be quite the splash! We are celebrating what we learned during Summer Sunday School with anticipation for Sunday School 2021-2022.

This summer we completed a 7-week creation unit, making a page each week for our individual creation books. Day 5 is pictured to the right. Then we dove into a 5-week curriculum called *Splash*. It covers stories from the Bible related to water. We got on the boat with Noah, went through the water with Moses, dipped in the water with Naaman, got tossed in the water with Jonah and weathered a storm with Jesus. Rally Day will reflect this *Splash* unit, so be prepared to get WET (but not drenched—bathing suits not required). We will meet in Wachorn Hall at 9:30 a.m. and proceed to the Splashdown area.

Rally Day will also mark the unveiling of a special Sunday School room. We are turning Room 216 into an interactive space for Bible stories with clay, paint, Legos, dramatic play, stem activities and more! This room will be used after Discovery Time. Children will come upstairs and hear the story from Discovery Time again in a different form. They may see a puppet show, watch a Youtube video or listen to a book. Afterward they'll interact with the story by using the materials in the room.

That's right—World Communion *Saturday*! This year the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon is scheduled for Sunday, October 3, which is World Communion Sunday. Due to lack of access to the church during the marathon, there will be no church activities that day. We'll celebrate World Communion the day before instead.

The information below is from the Presbyterian Mission Agency concerning the intent and history of a very special Sunday brought to the world by Presbyterians! It is fitting that this year we celebrate The Lord's Day on Saturday to accommodate visitors from around the globe who will run in memory of a sacred event in the life of our city. Fitting because World Communion Sunday celebrates our solidarity with our brother and sisters in Christ around the globe as we share in a sacred meal. The elements will be distributed in disposable containers as you enter the Sanctuary on Saturday, or they are available to pick up from the church office, if you will be worshipping remotely.

"The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to 'discern the body' when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration. One is not to go hungry while another is drunk! (I Cor. 11:21).

This is scandalous behavior opposed to the Way of Christ. Thus, it is appropriate that World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need.

John A. Dalles, a PCUSA pastor who has researched the history of World Communion Sunday notes this in his blog entry, reprinted from the October 7, 2002, issue of Presbyterian Outlook:

Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside Presbyterian Church) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another.

The Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed."
