Celebrating the Year of César Franck

In 2022, we will be celebrating with a year of César Franck's (December 10, 1822–November 8, 1890) organ work. Franck is John Edwards' favorite organ composer. You know that if John Edwards holds someone in high esteem, they've got to be pretty great! Below is a list of major organ works that will be played during the postlude on Sundays:
