# When Ordinary is Quite Extraordinary

The festivals and seasons of the Christian year (or liturgical calendar) offer a way to order the annual life of the church according to the life of Christ and the events of salvation history. January is always an exciting time in the life of the church if we are attentive to the changing of the liturgical season

In January, we move from the Season of Advent and Christmas to a period of Sundays known as ordinary time. Ordinary time is distinguished from the special times that call attention to the events that particularly reveal God's saving presence and work, such as Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost.

In ordinary time, we consider the implications of the particular events of redemption for our everyday, ordinary world. This makes ordinary time an extraordinary time as we are carried by the flow of the liturgical year to a time of serious contemplation. What are we being called to do as individuals and as a church right now to bear witness to the redemption we have found through Christ to the community around us? How are we to carry the life-changing, joyful implications of the birth of the Christ child beyond the walls of the sanctuary?

Those are the questions before your church officers this month and the questions each member of our church needs to ask themselves. I ask for your prayers of discernment for your Elders and Deacons as they shape the ministry and mission of the church in the coming year. I also welcome conversation with you individually if you have ideas for the church.

Every morning of 2022 when our feet first touch the ground, I hope each of us will say to ourselves with joy: *redeemed for a purpose*. This will serve as a daily reminder that you are forgiven, and you are called to be living with God. God grant that be our focus this year. If it is, 2022 will surely be extraordinary in the life of First Presbyterian Church.

#### Celebrating the Year of César Franck

In 2022, we will be celebrating with a year of César Franck's (December 10, 1822–November 8, 1890) organ work.

"The greatest organ composer of the French school in the nineteenth century was César Auguste Franck (1822-1890). A Belgian by birth, but French by education and adoption, this modest man exerted a profound effect upon his pupils and the development of organ music. The organ compositions of "Père (Father) Franck" were composed with the Cavaillé-Coll organ at Ste. Clotilde (Paris) in mind. Franck was an organist there from 1859 until his death. As the organ professor at the Paris Conservatoire, Franck emphasized the study of composition in his organ teaching." - Corless Richard Arnold

#### **January 30 Postlude (20 minutes)**


Prélude, Fugue et Variation, Op. 18 (1862), is one of Franck's loveliest compositions. The cantabile melody of the prelude in B minor is presented over a simple accompaniment. A short interlude of nine measures' length anticipates the fugue subject and returns the tonality to B minor. In the latter part of the fugue, the primary musical accent seems to fall on the second beat of several successive bars.

After the climactic end of the fugue, the serene melody of the prelude returns over a flowing 16th-note middle voice part.

Andantino in G minor, written in 1858 and published in 1889, is an early work of Franck. The Andantino is in A-B-A form with the first haunting melody returning after the secondary lyrical melody is sandwiched in between. The dance-like, rhythmical accompaniment makes this a delightfully lighthearted piece.


