

POSTLUDE Choral No. 2 in b (1890) César Franck

Postlude (15 minutes)

Choral No. 2 in B minor (1890) is in the variation form of a modified passacaglia. The first two chorals also contain interludes in recitative or free fantasy style, which interrupt the series of variations but which provide a refreshing, brief change in the musical material. Two sections, which resemble portions of Franck's Symphony in D minor, softly close the two large sections of the Second Choral; these same soft parts are examples of the type of musical writing which suggests the mysticism and religious idealism reflected in Franck's works. –Corless Richard Arnold
